### **Columbus-Area Firm Settles Software Piracy Claim**

*Mortgage Company Pays Software Watchdog Group \$139,000*

Washington, DC (03 November 1999) -- The Business Software Alliance (BSA) announced today that Worthington-based Broadview Mortgage Company agreed to pay \$139,000 to settle claims related to unlicensed copies of software programs. Currently, Ohio is one of the top ten states for software piracy settlements with the BSA. Nationally, the BSA has collected over \$44 million over the last six years.

"Unfortunately, it is not uncommon for good, reputable companies to find themselves with more software programs installed on their computers than they have licenses to support," said Bob Kruger, vice-president of enforcement for the BSA. "Companies should treat software just like any other asset. BSA recommends that all companies and organizations have strong software management policies in place that encourage compliance - including periodic internal audits, guidelines for supervisors and clear procedures for employees."

The unlicensed software at Broadview Mortgage Company was brought to the attention of the BSA by a phone call to its anti-piracy hotline: 1-888-NO-PIRACY. After being contacted by the BSA, Broadview Mortgage Company conducted a self-audit that confirmed there was an insufficient number of licenses for all of the copies of Corel, Microsoft, Novell and Symantec software installed on its computers. Along with the payment, Broadview Mortgage Company will destroy all unlicensed software, purchase replacement software and strengthen its software management policies.

"In late 1996 our IS department was badly under-staffed and we were careless in the management of our software licenses," said Steve K. Hartzler of Broadview Mortgage Company. "While over the years we have expended more than \$300,000 for software licenses, our self-audit disclosed unlicensed software, which we have now purchased at a cost of approximately \$33,000. We are now taking action to communicate an appropriate software policy and to create a central registry for monitoring our software."

According to a recent study, the U.S. software industry lost nearly \$2.9 billion to software piracy in 1998.\* This loss has a significant impact on the U.S. economy. It is estimated that software piracy cost the U.S. economy over 109,000 jobs and almost \$1 billion in tax revenue for 1998. \*\*
